"I did not return home for about thirty-seven years. I was there in 1916, but for a short time. I have often thought I would like to know something of my father's and mother's people. I know very little even about my sisters and brothers. My father had a large family. All had to work. None of his children got an education, not even a common school education.

"When I look back and think of all the hard work our family did, and how easy some others got on, the thought comes into my mind, if I have one, that the loving God, as the church people call Him is the 'bunk.' Therefore I am no church member, but am a christian in my own way."

(By Oscar G. Miller,⁶ Greensburg, Ind.)

Second—Michael Miller,⁴ who was my grandfather, was a splendid type of his father. He was a man of sound physical strength and was about 5 feet 9 inches in height and was temperate in his habits. He had a kind and benevolent countenance and a pleasant blue eye that was the index to a truly generous nature. On the ninth day of January, 1823, he was married to Miss Sarah Thompson. This was while they lived in Monroe County, Virginia, and on the thirteenth day of March in the same year they started to move from Monroe County, Virginia, to Indiana. Accordingly, they bid goodbye to their friends and started out on their long journey over mountains and rivers, plunging into the then almost unbroken wilderness of western Virginia and Ohio into the thick brush of an Indiana forest. They made the trip in a wagon which in this day and age would be very unique in appearance and would in all probability be the object of many an unkind word and humorous remark. It consisted of a light constructed running gears and a small bed and bows with a canvas cover stretched over them in the usual gypsy or movers style. The wagon had shafts to it and one horse was hitched in front of the other. In this wagon they had all their earthly possessions. It was a remarkably long journey to undertake at this time of the year through a new country. The mud roads of Spring seemed to have no bottoms to them and the rivers and creeks were swollen and many of them were out of their banks. They had started and had determined not to turn back. My grandmother was then only 19 years old, but in after years she often said that when she started to Indiana she had fully determined to be satisfied with her new home in the wilderness. And leaving many dear friends behind she was contented to stay in a land that promised to produce better crops than the mountains of Virginia, when it could be brought into cultivation.

After much traveling the family finally reached the Ohio River and made arrangements to cross by ferry. The horses were unhitched from the wagon and the wagon placed on the small ferry boat and the horses were made to swim by the side of the boat. In this way they crossed the river some miles above Cincinnati and soon afterwards stopped for two or three days with some relatives at Gallipolis. After making the short stop they again made ready to start and after a long journey westward they finally came to

the place where John Miller,³ his uncle, had moved a short time before, in Franklin County, Indiana, near Stepps Hill. They stopped there until he could have a chance to look around and pick out a desirable farm. He rented a small piece of land and put in a corn crop. During the summer he made a trip into the southern part of Rush County and decided to buy 160 acres of land which lies about one mile west of Richland. Accordingly, he went on to Brookville, Indiana, that town being the nearest Government land office and entered the land. He bought it for \$1.25 per acre which he paid in cash and which was about all the money he had. It might be said here that it was a good sound price for the land, taking into consideration that there was not a stick of timber on it that had been cut and no cabin to move into. The land was flat with heavy oak timber and dense underbrush covering the entire tract. That Fall he erected a small cabin with a puncheon floor, a clapboard roof with poles laid on top to hold the boards in place and a stick chimney daubed with clay. The door hung on wooden hinges and probably the largest ornament about the house was the large old-fashioned fireplace which was common in all cabins in those days. These were surely not built to economize firewood as it was very plentiful. What little furniture they had was plain and of the old-fashioned type. There was not a nail in the entire building, but wooden pins served the purpose of iron nails. My grandfather was quite handy with tools and constructed his cabin which was ready to move into in the Fall. Soon after he and his wife moved into the new cabin a son was born to them, on December 13th, and was named Christian.⁵

The winter was spent with not a few privations as they were but scantily supplied with provisions and lived largely on corn-bread. My grandfather had to go a long way to mill and usually went on horseback as going in a wagon was almost out of the question over the stumpy, swampy, muddy, and almost impassible roads. After a few years, when the roads got in better shape and the settlers became more numerous, several of them would join together and a large quantity of corn and wheat would be sent to mill. I have heard my father, Augustus Miller,³ say that his father used to go all the way to Connersville, a distance of about twenty miles, to mill.

During the winter and spring of 1823-24 he succeeded in clearing about five acres of ground to such an extent that he was able to plant it in corn. Of course it was a sorry-looking cornfield

for the stumps were very thick and deadened trees stood in various parts of the field. However, he succeeded in raising some corn but had to gather it early and put most of it away securely in the loft of his cabin to keep the gray squirrels which abounded in great numbers, from eating it or carrying it away to their dens in the huge trees of the forest. Game abounded on every hand, not only the smaller variety of game such as rabbits, foxes, squirrels and wild turkeys, but deer and bear were found in small numbers in various places. My grandfather was not much of a huntsman and rarely ever went hunting. However, he did on a few occasions kill some deer and a time or two he killed a bear, the meat of which was much appreciated and used by the early settlers of this country.

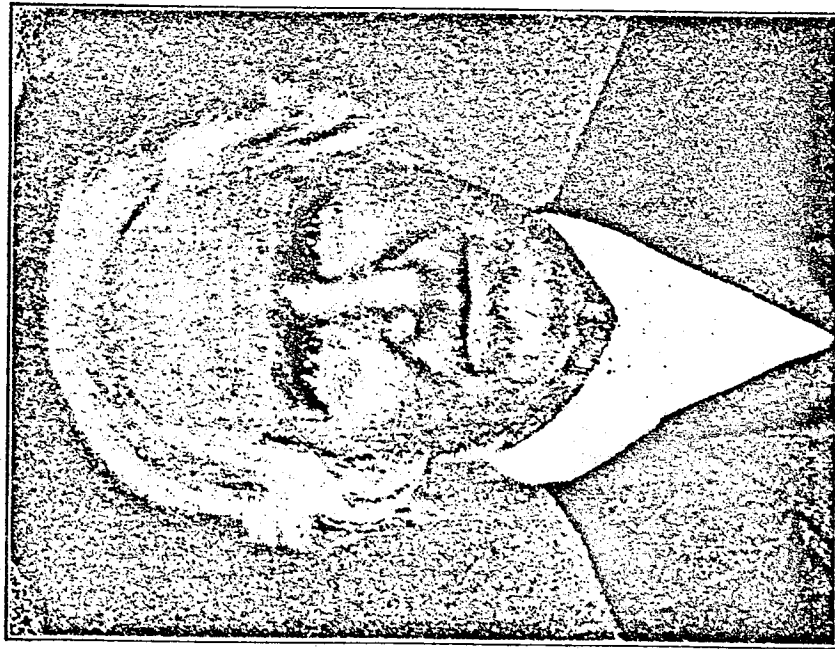

The following is an extract from a short biography of Augustus Miller, written by Rev. Alonzo Murphy, who was for a number of years a neighbor of Mr. Miller:

"Augustus Miller,⁵ a son of Michael Miller⁴ and Sarah Thompson Miller, was born in Rush County, Indiana, February 16, 1827. His father was one of the pioneer settlers of Rush County, Indiana. Augustus Miller enjoyed the distinction of having been born

in one of Indiana's now famous log cabins. Mr. Miller's early life was contemporary with all of the primitive conditions of the country in those formative days. He was perfectly familiar with every feature of pioneer life. He shared the happiness and the hardships, the trials and the triumphs incident to a generation engaged, as his was, in transforming a continent.

"Individually, Mr. Miller was a fortunately endowed man. In temperament he was mild mannered and well poised. He had a clear mind and a retentive memory. He possessed good social qualities. No man enjoyed the company of his friends more than he. He was fond of books and periodical literature. He read much, thought clearly, and remembered well."

From the foregoing it is easy therefore to account for the many excellent traits in the character of our subject. I think we will all agree that on the positive side, he took a positive stand. He never could be accused of any of the vices so common in the lives of many men of his time. The sterling qualities of this man demonstrated among his neighbors and friends, secured for him proper and appropriate recognition and reward. He was chosen to the office of County Commissioner, both in Rush and Decatur Counties, serving with honor in each instance.

In early life he united with the Methodist Episcopal Church, and for more than sixty years he was accounted as a faithful communicant of that church.

He was married to Miss Celia Winship, March 28, 1850. She was a woman of many wholesome virtues and helped to make his life a success from a spiritual as well as an economic standpoint.

To this marriage were born six children, all of which are spoken of elsewhere in this book. Mrs. Celia Winship Miller died May 25, 1892. Mr. Miller was afterwards married to Cerilda Lanham, who survived him with his three sons: Lucien B. Miller, who is a farmer, living in the city of Rushville, Ind.; Jesse F. Miller, also a farmer, living in Milroy, Ind.; and Oscar G. Miller, engaged in the practice of law in the city of Greensburg, Ind.

Augustus Miller died quietly and peaceably at his home in Greensburg, Ind., and was buried at the family cemetery of Richland, Ind. His death occurred March 24, 1914.

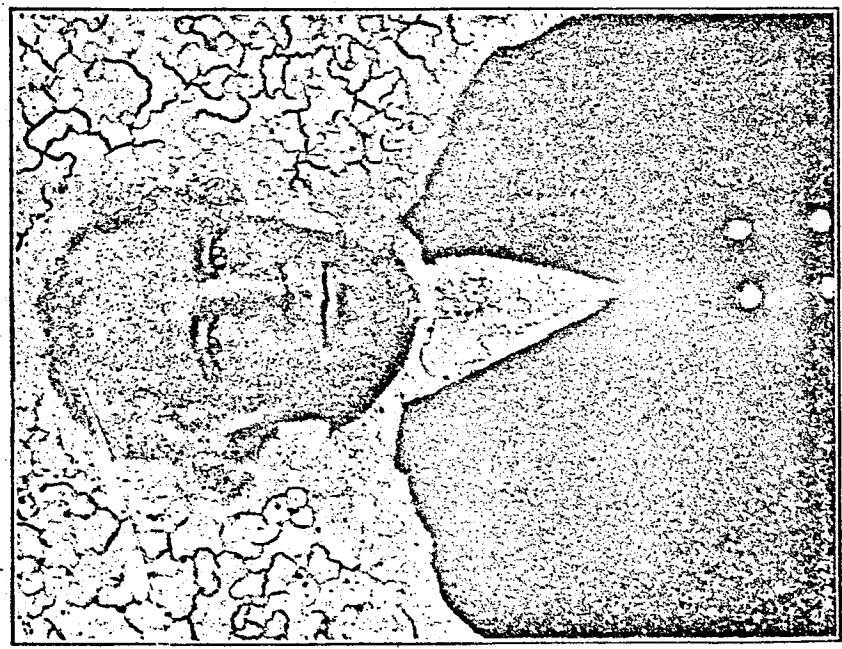
